- Where we are now: needs updating but really is a non-issue

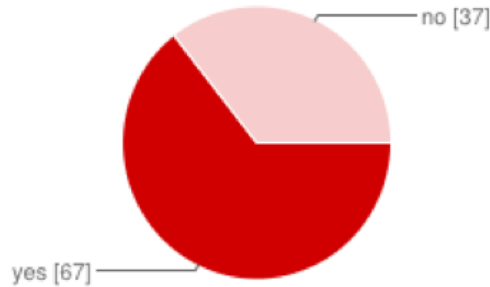
# today

- about 2700 devices a day on the network
- common to see students using smart phones, ipads, laptops, etc...
- some sets of 10 ipads used in classrooms
- some student issued iPads
- quite a lot of teachers using devices for classroom activities

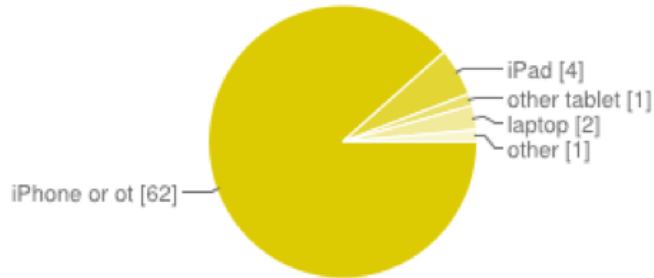
# March 2014 survey of teachers/counselors

PLSHS teachers, do you ever do activities where your students use their own devices?



yes	<b>67</b>	64%
no	<b>37</b>	36%

If you answered YES, which device do you most often see used by our students for class activities?



iPhone or other smartphone	<b>62</b>	89%
iPad	<b>4</b>	6%
other tablet	<b>1</b>	1%
laptop	<b>2</b>	3%
other	<b>1</b>	1%
